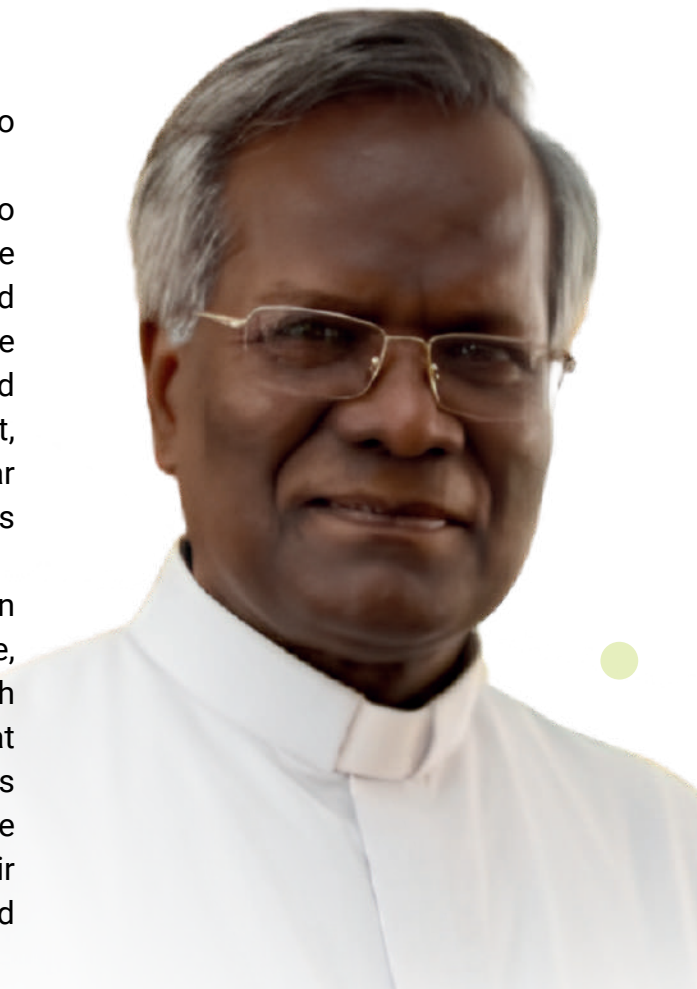
Dear Friends and Well-wishers of Don Bosco Vazhikaatti,

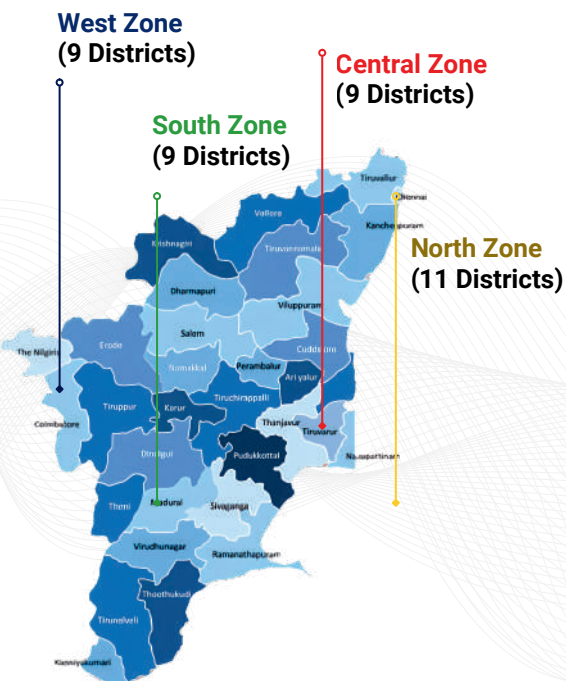
Don Bosco Vazhikaatti (DBV) is an initiative of the Salesian Province of Chennai (INM) under the Youth Ministry Department. It serves youth across Tamil Nadu (from Chennai to Nilgiris), along with Puducherry, the Andaman & Nicobar Islands, and Fujairah (UAE).

DBV is committed to empowering underprivileged youth by creating a positive learning environment that nurtures the right mindset, essential skills, and strong values. Inspired by Saint John Bosco, the organization enables young people to grow into responsible and productive citizens.

Headquartered in Perambur, Chennai, with sub-centres across Tamil Nadu, DBV continues to transform lives through education, opportunity, and hope.

For effective administration and outreach, the districts are organized into four zones:

- **Central Zone (9 Districts):** Ariyalur, Karur, Nagapattinam, Mayiladuthurai, Perambalur, Pudukkottai, Thanjavur, Tiruchirappalli, Tiruvarur
- **North Zone (11 Districts):** Chennai, Cuddalore, Kallakurichi, Kanchipuram, Chengalpattu, Ranipet, Tiruvallur, Tiruvannamalai, Tirupattur, Vellore, Villupuram
- **South Zone (9 Districts):** Kanyakumari, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Sivagangai, Tenkasi, Theni, Tirunelveli, Tuticorin, Virudhunagar
- **West Zone (9 Districts):** Coimbatore, Dharmapuri, Dindigul, Erode, Krishnagiri, Namakkal, Nilgiris, Salem, Tiruppur

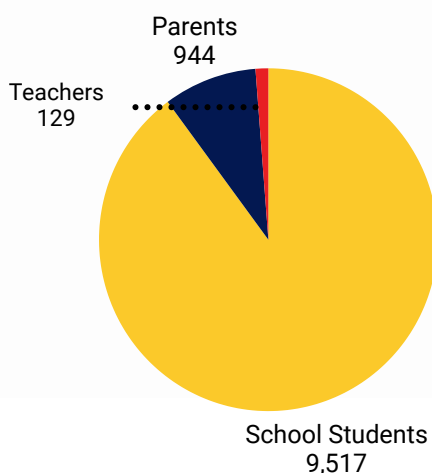

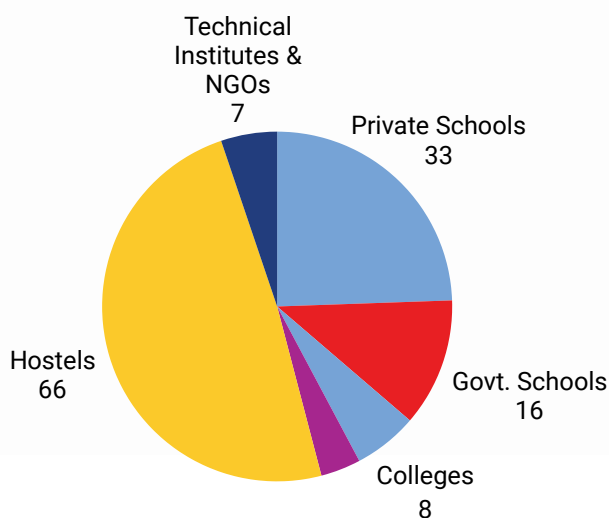
Department of Career Guidance

At Don Bosco Vazhikaatti, we believe that early exposure to career possibilities empowers students to make informed and confident decisions about their future. Since its inception in 1997, our Career Guidance for School Students programme has shaped the dreams and aspirations of thousands of young minds. Designed to spark curiosity, build awareness, and nurture ambition, the programme offers a range of student-focused services, including career path exploration, personalized one-on-one counselling, and awareness sessions on competitive exams such as NEET, JEE (Mains & Advanced), and CUET. We also provide guidance on professional courses like CA, ACCA, CS, and CMA, helping students understand diverse academic and career pathways. A unique highlight of our initiative is the “Career Guidance on Wheels”, a mobile outreach programme that brings career awareness directly to schools and communities, especially in underserved areas.

Overall Coverage



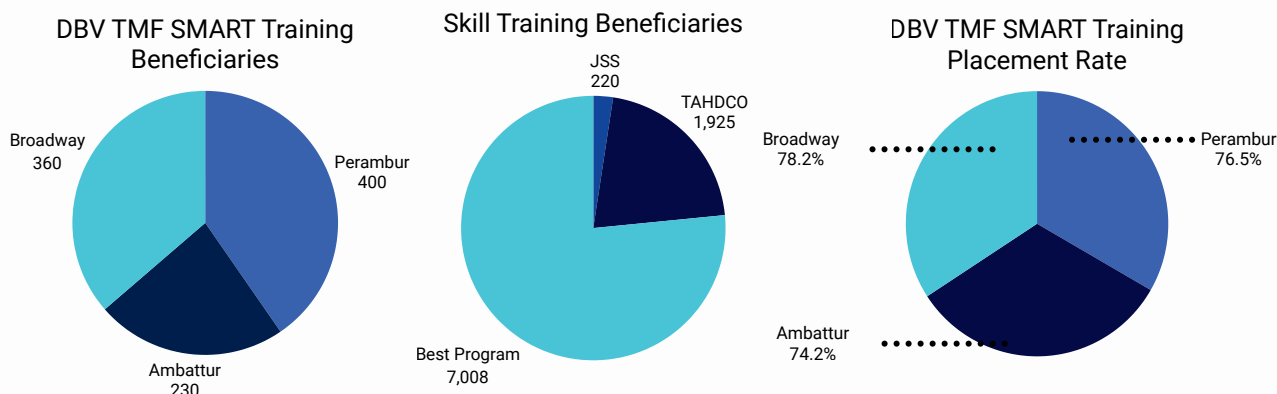

Department of Training

During FY 2025–26, Don Bosco Vazhikaatti delivered high-impact, collaborative interventions empowering marginalized youth across Tamil Nadu through strong government and institutional partnerships. In collaboration with the Adi Dravidar Welfare Department via Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Housing and Development Corporation (TAHDCO), the **Social Lab Project** reached 55 ADW hostels across 13 districts, strengthening Functional English and Life Skills among UG and PG students through a structured 3-zone model. The partnership with **Jan Shikshan Sansthan** under the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship enabled access to Central Government Certified Skill Programs, enhancing employability and formal recognition. Complementing this, the **Lalla Palla Program** provided practical training in computer skills and tailoring, while the **BEST - Bosco Employability Skill Training Program** focused on holistic personal and professional development of college students. Through **TMF SMART Centres** (Perambur, Broadway, Ambattur), advanced digital training in Tally, MIS, Advanced Excel, Power BI, and Data Analytics aligned youth with industry-relevant careers, collectively strengthening career readiness, confidence, and sustainable livelihood opportunities for underserved communities. These initiatives have directly contributed to bridging the gap between education and employment for marginalized youth. They have enabled young individuals to adapt to evolving industry demands with confidence and competence. Overall, the programs continue to create scalable, inclusive, and future-ready youth development pathways.



BEST - Bosco Employability Skill Training Program

The BEST Program is the flagship skill-development initiative of DBV, specifically tailored for 1st, 2nd and final-year undergraduate & postgraduate students.

BEST is designed to transform students into "dependable" human beings with a clear career path.

Methodology:

- Highly interactive, activity-based learning featuring simulations, group discussions, and presentations.

This program aligns seamlessly with **NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council)** criteria by elevating institutional quality through skill-based programs, enhanced employability outcomes, and inclusive initiatives that drive academic excellence and societal relevance.

Teaching Methodology: The delivery is highly practical, utilizing a mix of interactive sessions, formal presentations, participative exercises, and structured Question & Answer segments.



TMF SMART Training Program

Don Bosco Vazhikaatti continued to strengthen its commitment to industry-relevant skill development and inclusive youth empowerment through its SMART Centres in Broadway, Perambur, and Ambattur.

The Broadway SMART Centre (est. 2013) equipped youth with in-demand financial and service sector competencies, offering structured training in Tally (Finance & Accounting), BFSI, and Business Correspondence & Facilitation, enabling participants to transition confidently into the workforce.

The Perambur SMART Centre (est. 2015), located at the DBV headquarters, focuses on advanced and emerging skill domains, including Tally Prime and MIS Executive. The centre promoted a self-learning mindset, encouraging continuous upskilling and adaptability to evolving industry needs.

The Ambattur SMART Centre (est. 2024), a women-centric training hub at Annai Violet College, provided a safe, inclusive, and empowering environment for women to develop market-relevant skills, build professional confidence, and access meaningful career opportunities.

Collectively, the SMART Centres functioned as dynamic skill ecosystems, integrating technical training with personal and professional development. These initiatives continued to create sustainable, inclusive, and future-ready pathways for youth and women to achieve employment, self-reliance, and long-term growth.



Jan Shikshan Sansthan - JSS

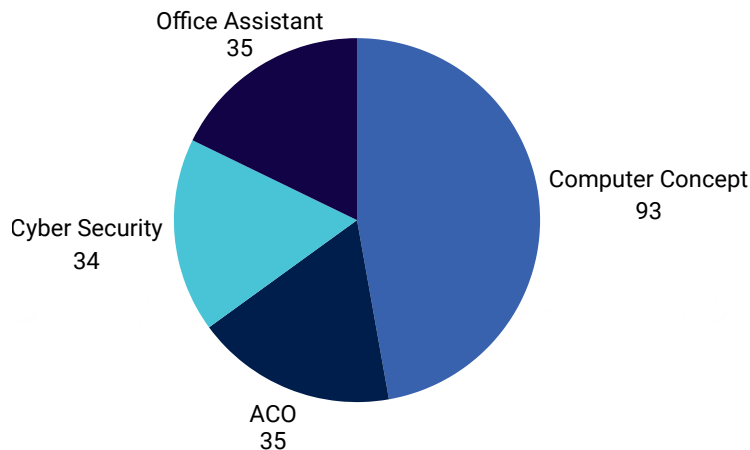
As a new strategic initiative in FY 2025–26, Don Bosco Vazhikaatti partnered with Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS), an institution sponsored by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, to strengthen access to Central Government–certified skill development programs for marginalized youth.

This initiative was launched to bridge the gap between informal skills and formal recognition, enabling beneficiaries to gain nationally recognized certification alongside livelihood-oriented training. Through this program, youth are equipped with industry-relevant competencies, enhancing their employability, credibility, and pathways to sustainable income. The JSS initiative marks a significant step in expanding DBV’s impact by integrating certification with skill training, thereby creating structured and scalable opportunities for economic empowerment and social inclusion.



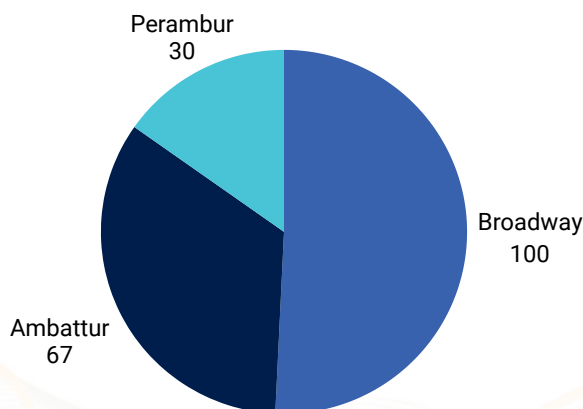
This pie chart represents the distribution of students across different training domains conducted under DBV JSS (2025–2026). The data highlights the participation of students in various skill development programmes such as **Computer Concepts, Cyber Security, ACO and Office Assistant**

Domain-wise Breakdown



- Computer Concept training has the highest share at 47.2%, showing a strong focus on digital and technical skills.
- ACO and Office Assistant each contribute 17.8%, indicating balanced importance for administrative and operational skills.
- Cyber Security accounts for 17.3%, reflecting steady interest in security-related training.
- Overall, the distribution highlights a well-balanced skill development approach with emphasis on IT fundamentals alongside professional skills.

Centre Wise Distribution



- Broadway Centre leads with 50.8%, indicating maximum outreach and training engagement.
- AVC Centre contributes 34%, maintaining strong participation.
- Perambur Centre accounts for 15.2%, reflecting steady enrolment.

Social Lab – Functional English & Life Skills Program (TAHDCO)

As a new initiative launched in FY 2025–26, Don Bosco Vazhikaatti implemented The **Social Lab – Functional English & Life Skills Program** with the support of the Adi Dravidar Welfare Department, Government of Tamil Nadu, through the Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Housing and Development Corporation (TAHDCO).



The program is designed to strengthen Functional English communication and essential life skills among UG and PG students residing in Social Justice Boys and Girls Hostels, enabling them to build confidence, improve communication, and enhance their readiness for higher education and employment.

During the year, the initiative scaled across 55 hostels in 13 districts of Tamil Nadu, implemented through a structured three-zone model to ensure effective delivery and monitoring:

Zone 1: Chennai & Chengalpattu – 17 Hostels

Zone 2: Cuddalore, Dharmapuri, Kallakurichi, Krishnagiri, Ranipet, Nilgiris & Thiruvallur – 21 Hostels

Zone 3: Tiruvannamalai, Vellore, Viluppuram & Tirupathur – 17 Hostels

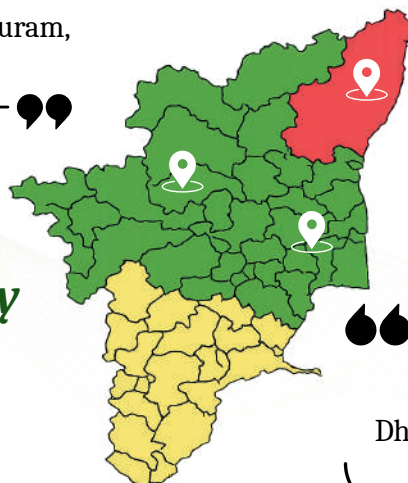

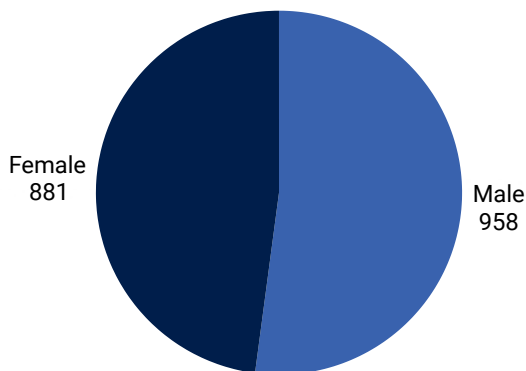

Social Lab – Functional English & Life Skills Program was implemented across 55 hostels in various districts of Tamil Nadu. The initiative successfully reached 1,839 students, providing structured training sessions aimed at enhancing students’ personal development, employability awareness, and life skills.

Gender-wise Participation

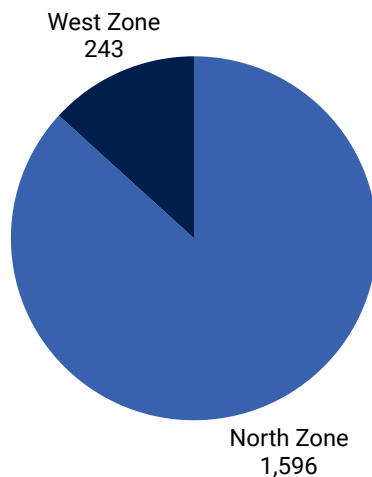


This distribution reflects the program’s inclusive approach in engaging students across both boys’ and girls’ hostels.

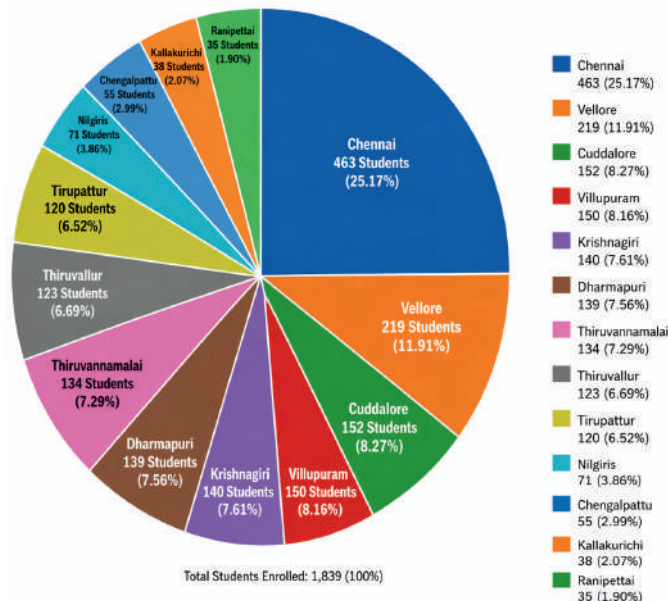


The North Zone accounted for the majority of student participation due to the higher concentration of hostels in the region.

Training sessions were conducted in the hostels on scheduled days, typically during evening hours, ensuring that students could participate without affecting their regular academic schedules.

Lalla Palla Training Program

Launched in FY 2025–26, the Lalla Palla Point Project represents a focused effort by Don Bosco Vazhikaatti to uplift vulnerable communities in Chennai through structured support and livelihood opportunities.



The initiative emphasizes practical skill-building as a pathway to economic independence, introducing **training programs in Information Technology and Tailoring at the Perambur Head Office and Lourdes Shrine**. These programs are designed to equip participants with hands-on skills that directly translate into income-generating opportunities.

By nurturing self-reliance, confidence, and employability, the project enables individuals to take meaningful steps toward financial stability and improved quality of life. It stands as a grassroots intervention that promotes dignity, inclusion, and sustainable community development.



Competitive Exam Training & Orientation – New Initiative

In FY 2025–26, Don Bosco Vazhikaatti introduced a focused Competitive Exam Training Initiative to empower government job aspirants with the skills, strategy, and confidence required to succeed in exams such as TNPSC and UPSC. The TNPSC Coaching Program was delivered over three intensive weekends, covering Tamil and Mathematics, followed by a comprehensive mock examination designed to simulate real exam conditions and assess candidate readiness. Through expert-led, interactive sessions, over 200+ participants strengthened their conceptual understanding, problem-solving ability, and time management skills, resulting in improved confidence and exam preparedness.

Further enriching this initiative, a Competitive Exam Orientation Program was conducted by Israel Jebasingh, engaging 60 college students from diverse institutions. The session provided clear guidance on exam pathways, preparation strategies, and disciplined study approaches, inspiring aspirants to pursue civil services with clarity and determination. A live mock interview demonstration served as a key highlight, offering participants real-time exposure to interview dynamics, communication skills, and analytical thinking expected in competitive examinations.

Together, these interventions established a structured and aspirational learning ecosystem for government job aspirants, enabling them to transition from uncertainty to clarity and from preparation to performance. This initiative reinforces Don Bosco Vazhikaatti’s commitment to career-focused training, equitable access to opportunities, and long-term youth empowerment.



Department of Job Placement

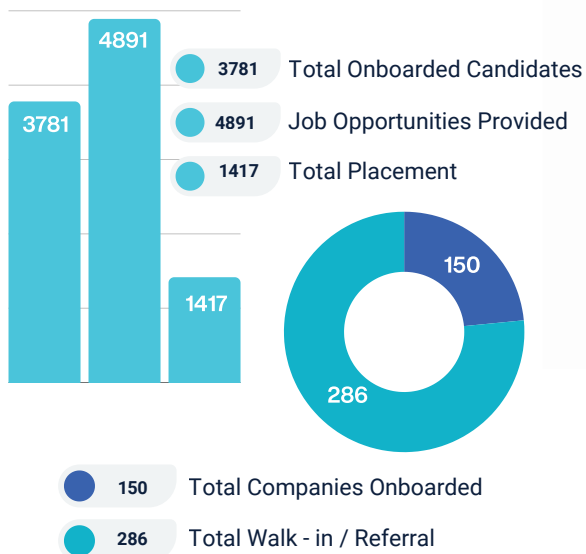
The Job Placement Network (JPN)—a flagship initiative of the Salesian Provincial Conference of South Asia—is a result-oriented platform connecting underprivileged youth to decent and sustainable employment. Recognized by the Ministry of Labour and Employment under the National Career Service (NCS), JPN bridges the gap between skills and opportunities.

Through career guidance, employability training, and placement support, the initiative prepares youth with market-relevant skills and workplace readiness, linking them to opportunities via job fairs, campus drives, walk-ins, and referrals across sectors such as manufacturing, finance, healthcare, education, and hospitality.

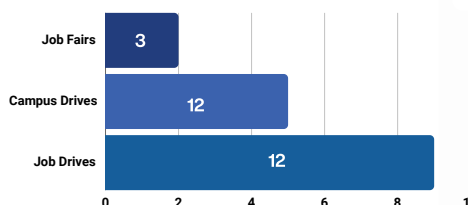

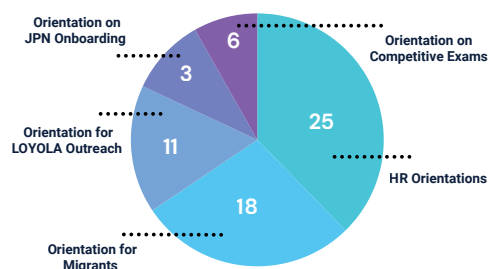
Placement Analysis

During the reporting period, **27 residents** were engaged in employment across different sectors, demonstrating the success of livelihood initiatives, while **8 residents** were pursuing their education, supported with a conducive atmosphere for academic growth. The hostel emphasizes not only accommodation but also character formation, life skills, and personal responsibility, ensuring that each resident is guided toward self-reliance and a dignified future. Through continuous mentoring and a supportive community structure, Bosco Hostel remains a vital component in empowering vulnerable youth to transition into confident and productive members of society.

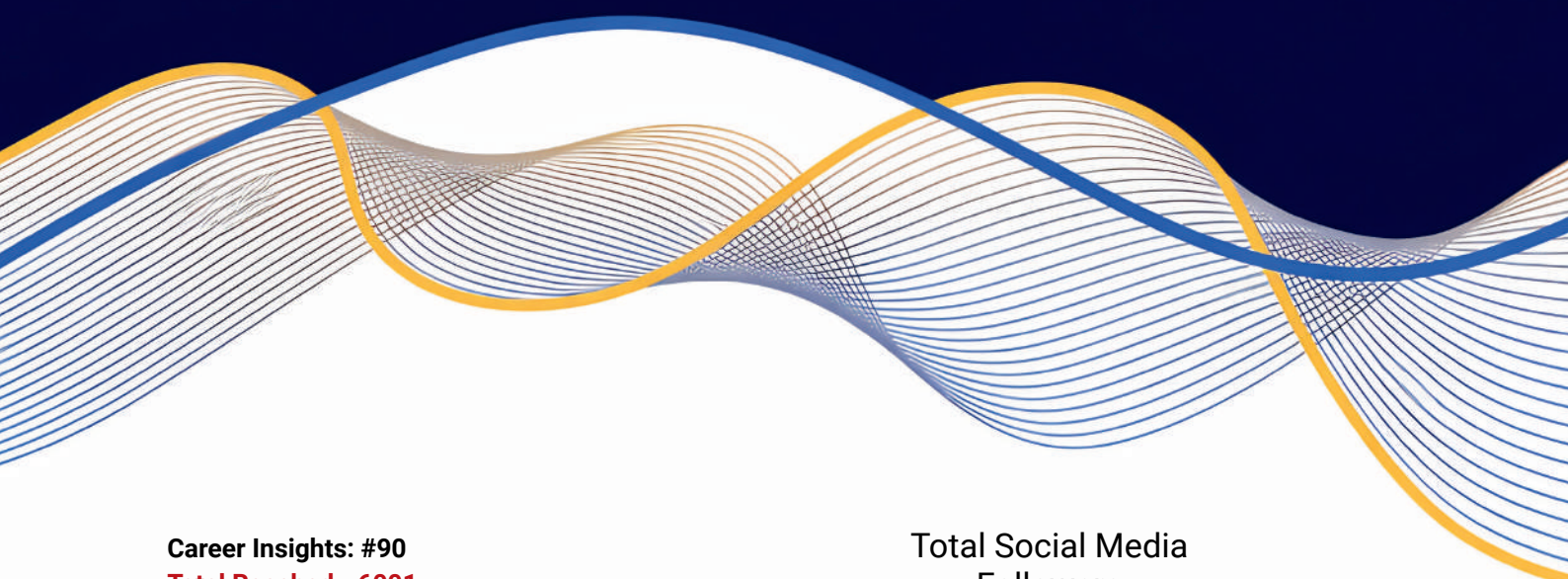


Slate Digital Learning Program

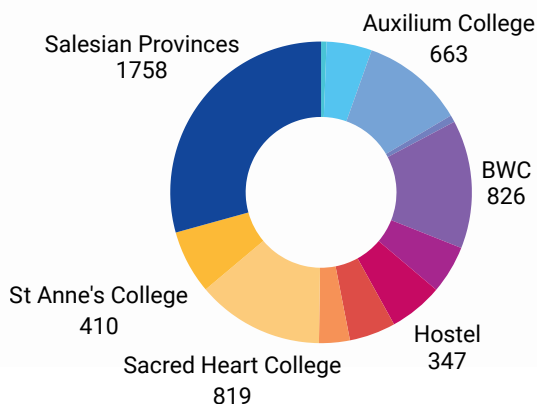
