#### Department of Career Guidance

Career Guidance @ Lourdes Higher Secondary School, Perambur



On 04 November 2025 the activities began on, when the department conducted a combined career awareness session for students from both the Science and Arts streams. A total of ninety-seven students from the Science group and eighty-seven from the Arts group attended this session. The program offered them an in-depth understanding of higher education pathways, competitive examinations, and skill-based career opportunities. Students showed tremendous enthusiasm and actively participated by asking questions that reflected their curiosity about future prospects. The session helped them develop a clearer picture of the academic and professional choices available to them.



# Career Guidance Program @ Jawadhi Hills

The department continued its activities on 07 and 08 November 2025, when sixty-four students participated in a two-day employability skill development program. These sessions concentrated on improving essential workplace skills such as communication, decision-making, and basic aptitude abilities. Students were engaged in interactive activities that encouraged them to think critically, express themselves clearly, and work effectively in team settings. The hands-on approach used during these two days ensured that the participants not only understood the concepts but also applied them practically.









# Bosco Employability Skills Training (BEST) Program & Social Skills Enhancement at Auxilium College (Autonomous), Vellore.

The largest program of the month took place on 13 and 14 November 2025, when a total of nine hundred and twenty-three students attended the Career **Awareness** Mega Sessions. These sessions provided comprehensive overview of current job market trends. the increasing importance of soft skills, the availability of scholarships, and the academic pathways available across streams. Students were particularly interested in understanding changing nature of work and the prospects linked to different sectors. The sessions were highly interactive and received extremely positive feedback from both the students and the faculty members.







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## Career Guidance Program @ Jawadhi Hills

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#### Career Guidance Conclave @ Don Bosco Egmore



On 15 November 2025, another largescale program was conducted for eight hundred and seventy students. This session focused mainly on development personal and motivation. Students were guided through activities that encouraged them to reflect on their strengths, fears, and personal ambitions. The trainers emphasized the importance of emotional intelligence, confidencebuilding, and positive thinking, which left a lasting impact on participants.









# BEST Program & JEE Orientation @ Govt Girls Higher Secondary School

On 18 November 2025, the department conducted two separate programs on the same day. The first was a small-group mentoring session attended by eleven students, who received highly personalized guidance tailored to their immediate academic concerns and future goals. The second session, attended by ninety-eight students, focused on personality development and communication improvement. Students were introduced to the importance of presenting themselves effectively and understanding their own behavioural patterns.

# Valedictory Ceremony with the Inauguration of the Dr. R. Deivanayagam Memorial Award


