**BEST Employability Session - DBC Yelagiri Hills**



On 6th February 2026, the BEST Program (Building Employability Skills and Talent) conducted an intensive session specifically for the 2nd-year students at DBC Yelagiri Hills. This program was attended by 185 beneficiaries who are currently at a critical juncture in their undergraduate studies where professional transition becomes a priority. The curriculum focused heavily on building essential employability skills, such as effective communication, workplace etiquette, and technical adaptability. By engaging in these practical exercises, the students were able to assess their own career readiness and identify specific areas for improvement. This session served as a vital stepping stone in preparing them for the rigors and expectations of their upcoming professional lives.



## **BEST Orientation for First-Year Students - DBC**



On 7th February 2026, a comprehensive orientation session was held for 225 first-year college students at DBC Yelagiri Hills under the banner of the BEST Program. Recognizing that the first year of college is the ideal time to plant the seeds of professional discipline, the session introduced these young learners to the fundamentals of long-term career planning. The facilitators provided a roadmap for skill development, encouraging students to look beyond their textbooks and understand the global job market's requirements. By establishing this foundation early, the program helped the freshmen align their academic choices with their future professional goals. The large turnout of over 200 students highlighted the growing interest in proactive career preparation from the very start of higher education.



Memory & Study Skills Session - St. Theresa Church, Sembiam



On 8th February 2026, a specialized memory tips and study skills session was organized at St. Theresa Church, Sembiam, to support students during the peak of the academic season. This session was tailored for 30 beneficiaries from the 10th and 12th grades, who are currently preparing for their high-stakes board examinations. The training provided them with

practical, scientifically-backed techniques for memory enhancement, such as mnemonic devices and visualization strategies, to improve retention. Additionally, students were taught effective exam preparation schedules and stress management tips to help them perform at their peak under pressure. This community-based initiative ensured that these students felt academically supported and mentally confident as they approached their finals.



## Career Guidance Session – Govt Schools



### **Career Guidance Session – Govt School, Bundergarden**

On 16th February 2026, the team also conducted a vital Career Guidance (CG) session at the Government School in Bundergarden, reaching 40 eager students. This session was primarily focused on career path identification, helping students recognize their natural talents and how those can translate into viable vocations. Many of these students lacked access to professional career counseling, making this intervention crucial for their future decision-making process. The facilitators used interactive tools to map out various industries and the educational pathways required to enter them. By the end of the day, the students had a much clearer vision of the professional possibilities available to them after completing their schooling.

### **Career Guidance Session – Govt School, Ayanavaram**

On 17th February 2026, the career guidance outreach continued at the Government School in Ayanavaram, where 35 students participated in a professional orientation program. The core of this session was dedicated to providing specific advice regarding stream selection, which is a significant turning point for high school students. Facilitators explained the long-term implications of choosing Science, Commerce, or Arts, ensuring that students make informed choices based on interest rather than peer pressure. The session also addressed various vocational training options for those looking to enter the workforce through technical routes. This personalized approach allowed students to ask detailed questions about specific subjects and the career trajectories they lead to.

## Career Guidance Session – Govt Madarasa Azam School

On 18th February 2026, a dedicated Career Guidance program was provided to 40 beneficiaries at the Government Madarasa Azam School to broaden their academic horizons. The session aimed to bridge the information gap by introducing students to a wide array of modern career opportunities they might not have previously considered. Through detailed presentations, the students were guided on how to navigate the transition from school to higher education while maintaining a focus on their professional aspirations. The facilitators emphasized the importance of continuous learning and digital literacy in today's rapidly evolving job market. This program provided the beneficiaries with the necessary tools and motivation to pursue their future academic and professional journeys with clarity.



## Stream-Based Career Guidance - St. Joseph's School, Assissi Nagar



On 21st February 2026, a massive and comprehensive Career Guidance session was conducted for 142 students at St. Joseph's School in Assissi Nagar. To ensure the advice was relevant and actionable, the group was strategically divided into two specialized streams for more targeted insights. One session catered to 70 students in the Science stream, focusing on engineering, medicine, and research opportunities, while the other assisted 72 students in the Arts stream with insights into humanities, law, and creative industries. This bifurcated approach allowed for deep dives into entrance exams, top-tier colleges, and specific industry trends for each respective field. The high level of engagement from both students and staff made this one of the most successful outreach events of the month.

## Orientation Programme - St. Anne's College




