

BEST - Technical and Vocational Education Training (TVET) Program

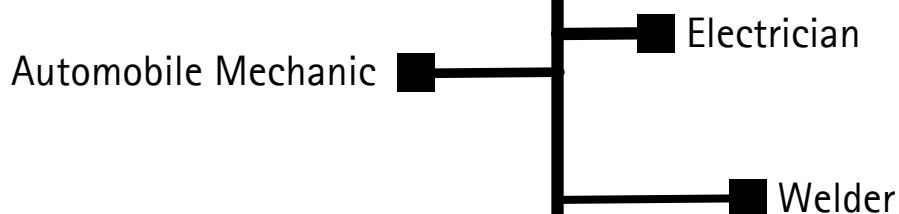


Introduction

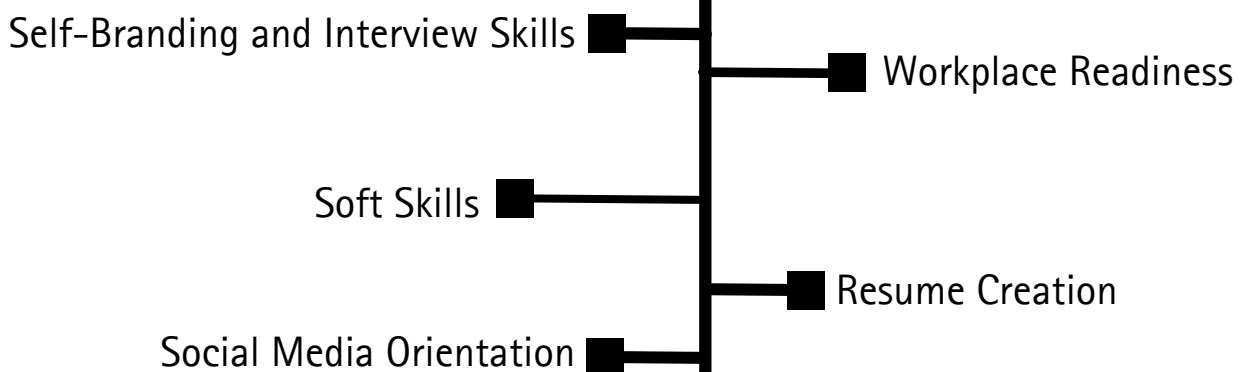


Inaugural Ceremony

Sessions



The program was divided into two batches, with each group participating in the following sessions, designed to build both personal and professional skills:

Session 1

Self-Branding and Interview Skills, Social Media Orientation

Facilitator: Mr. Leo Levin

Mr. Leo Levin kicked off the first session with a deep dive into the significance of self branding and interview skills. In today's competitive job market, the ability to present oneself effectively is crucial. Mr. Levin introduced students to techniques for building their personal brand, emphasizing the importance of how they are perceived both in-person and online. The session also included an insightful social media orientation, guiding students on how to use platforms like LinkedIn to build a professional network and enhance visibility within the industry.



Session 2

Resume Creation, Workplace Readiness, and Soft Skills

Facilitator: Mr. Rob

Mr. Rob led an engaging session on how to create an impactful resume. He walked the students through the structure and key components of a strong resume, advising them on how to showcase their skills, experiences, and achievements in a way that would appeal to potential employers. Special emphasis was placed on tailoring the resume to match the requirements of the automobile, electrical, and welding sectors, which helped the students gain practical insights into industry-specific expectations.



Session 3

Workplace Readiness and Soft Skills

Facilitator: Mr. Mohan Prem

The final session of the day, led by Mr. Mohan Prem, focused on equipping students with the soft skills necessary to thrive in the workplace. This included communication, time management, teamwork, and problem-solving. Mr. Prem emphasized that while technical expertise is important, soft skills are what often differentiate a good employee from a great one. The session also discussed the expectations and dynamics of a professional environment, helping students understand how to navigate challenges and succeed in their careers.



Feedback

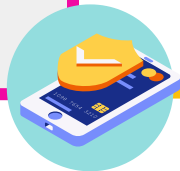
