Sessions

Session 1

Self-Branding and Interview Skills

He emphasized the importance of developing a professional identity, not just on paper but also through social media. Session 2

Resume Creation

Mr. Rob provided an insightful and interactive workshop on how to create a standout resume. He demonstrated the do's and don'ts of resume writing, encouraging students to focus on their key skills and practical experiences. By offering practical examples, Mr. Rob ensured that each student left with a better understanding of how to craft a resume that would capture the attention of hiring managers in their respective industries.



Session 3



Workplace Readiness and Soft Skills

Mr. Mohan Prem's session was focused on preparing the students for the realities of the workplace. He covered a wide range of topics including communication skills, teamwork, time management, and problem-solving—skills that are vital for success in any professional setting. Mr. Prem's engaging approach allowed students to understand how these soft skills are just as important as technical expertise in a career.

Feedback

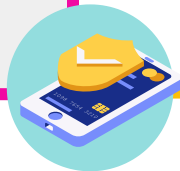
