Introduction

Don Bosco Vazhikaatti (DBV) hosted a transformative Technical and Vocational Education Training (TVET) program on March 25, 2025, at the Don Bosco Tech Campus (Polytechnic & ITI), Basin Bridge. This program catered to final-year ITI and Diploma students, including those specializing in trades such as Machinist, Electrician, Fitter, and various engineering disciplines like Mechanical, Electronics & Communication, Electrical & Electronics, Production, and Refrigeration & AC Mechanic. Additionally, a linked training course in Zwick Roel Material Testing was offered, creating a comprehensive and diverse platform for skill building. With a total of 153 students in attendance, this program aimed to prepare students for the challenges of the workforce by equipping them with both technical and professional development skills.

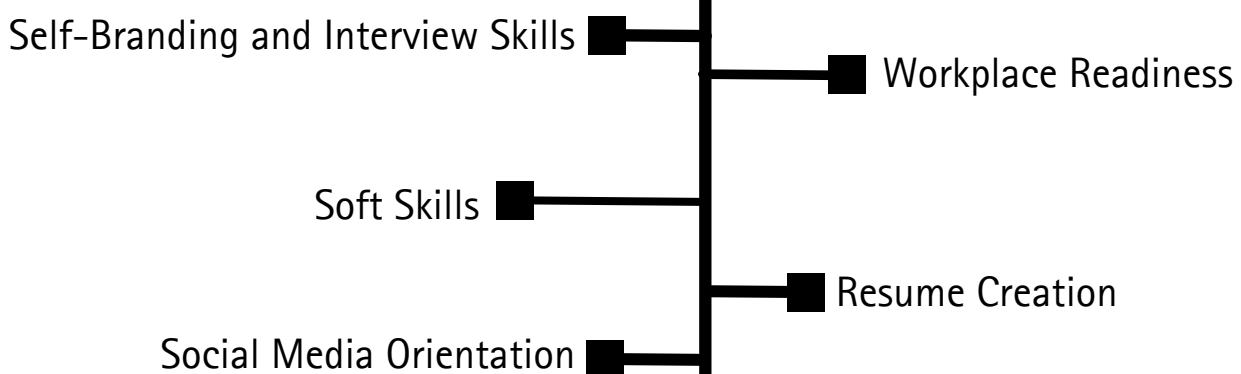


Inaugural Ceremony

Sessions

Session 1

Feedback

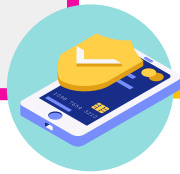
At the end of the day, 47 students provided feedback on the program, with the following breakdown: • Diploma Students: 34 • ITI Students: 8 • Zwick Roel Students: 5 The feedback was overwhelmingly positive, with students appreciating the practical skills gained during the sessions. Many highlighted the resume creation and interview skills as the most useful parts of the program. The emphasis on social media orientation also resonated strongly with students, who acknowledged its growing relevance in securing job opportunities in today's digital age. Overall, students reported feeling more prepared to enter the workforce with a better understanding of how to present themselves professionally and the importance of soft skills in their careers.
