



## Career Guidance Program St. Bede's Anglo-Indian School

On 1st August 2025, the month began with a career guidance program at St. Bede's Anglo-Indian School. A total of 83 students benefited from the session, which aimed at enhancing career awareness and academic preparedness.









## Career Guidance Program, Government Girls High School (Science Stream)

On 6th August, 2025 a program was conducted for the Science stream students of Government Girls High School. A total of 83 students participated in the session, which focused on academic planning and future career pathways in the science domain.

## Career Guidance Program Government Girls High School [Arts Stream]

On 7th August, 2025 the department reached out to the Arts stream students of the same institution.

This session witnessed an overwhelming participation of 116 students, where the emphasis was on building confidence, exploring opportunities in the arts and humanities, and equipping learners with motivation to pursue higher studies.









## Career Guidance Program Govt Girls High School [10th Std: Memory & Study Tips]

On 8th August, 2025 a specialized session was organized for 135 students of 10th standard at Government Girls High School.

The program focused on memory techniques, study tips, and exam strategies, ensuring that students develop strong foundations in preparation for board examinations.

## Career Guidance Program Government School (12th Std: Science Stream)

On 8th August, 2025, the same day, another program was conducted for 59 students of 12th standard Science stream.

The session highlighted career opportunities in science, effective exam preparation, and higher education options.









## Career Guidance Program Don Bosco Hr. Sec. School, Redhills

On 9th August, 2025 Two separate sessions were organized at Don Bosco Hr. Sec. School, Redhills:

Science Stream (12th Std): 83 students attended the program, receiving guidance on science-related career fields and exam planning.

Arts Stream (12th Std): 73 students participated in the session, gaining clarity on future pathways in arts and allied disciplines.

## Career Guidance Program St. Joseph ITI, Basin Bridge

On 13th August, 2025 the department conducted a Freshers' Orientation and Motivation Program at St. Joseph ITI, Basin Bridge.

This program had the highest student participation in the month, with 152 students. It focused on motivating freshers, instilling confidence, and providing guidance on technical skill-building and employability.

August 11: Insights into the 24 National Law Universities


August 14: CLAT Exam Section B - Logical Reasoning

## Yuva English Endline Assessment

On 1st and 8th August 2025, the Yuva English Endline Assessments were conducted for batches 10034, 10035, and 10036, with a total of 45 students participating. The assessments evaluated students' improvements in spoken English, comprehension, and confidence in public speaking. Trainers noted significant progress among participants, reflecting the effectiveness of structured language training. Students actively engaged in the test activities, showcasing fluency and accuracy. The assessment also provided valuable insights into areas for improvement, helping trainers refine future sessions.







## MOU RENEWAL WITH BAKTHAVATSALAM MEMORIAL COLLEGE

On 7th August 2025, DBV renewed its MoU with Bakthavatsalam Memorial College for the fifth consecutive year, reinforcing training and placement opportunities. With 32 students participating, the renewal highlights DBV's commitment to academic excellence, career readiness, and long-term educational growth.

### **Guest Lecture**

On 9th August 2025, a guest lecture was delivered by Mr. Kevin, an Accountant, on the topic of Tax Deducted at Source (TDS). The lecture enhanced their technical knowledge, preparing them for careers in accounting and finance. ## Independence Day Celebration



## **World Humanitarian Day Observation**




## Career Insights Issues






