


Employability Skills Training @ Perambur








YouTube Video Releases

World Rose Day Activities






Session on Employability Skills by Career Guidance Team

84 candidates did not attend but remain in communication. 20 candidates are awaiting updates from HR or have not received calls. 16 selected candidates declined offers due to lack of interest or existing employment, while 4 are pursuing higher studies. Additionally, 92 candidates expressed individual job preferences such as non-voice or administrative roles.




Career Insights - September & October 2025


